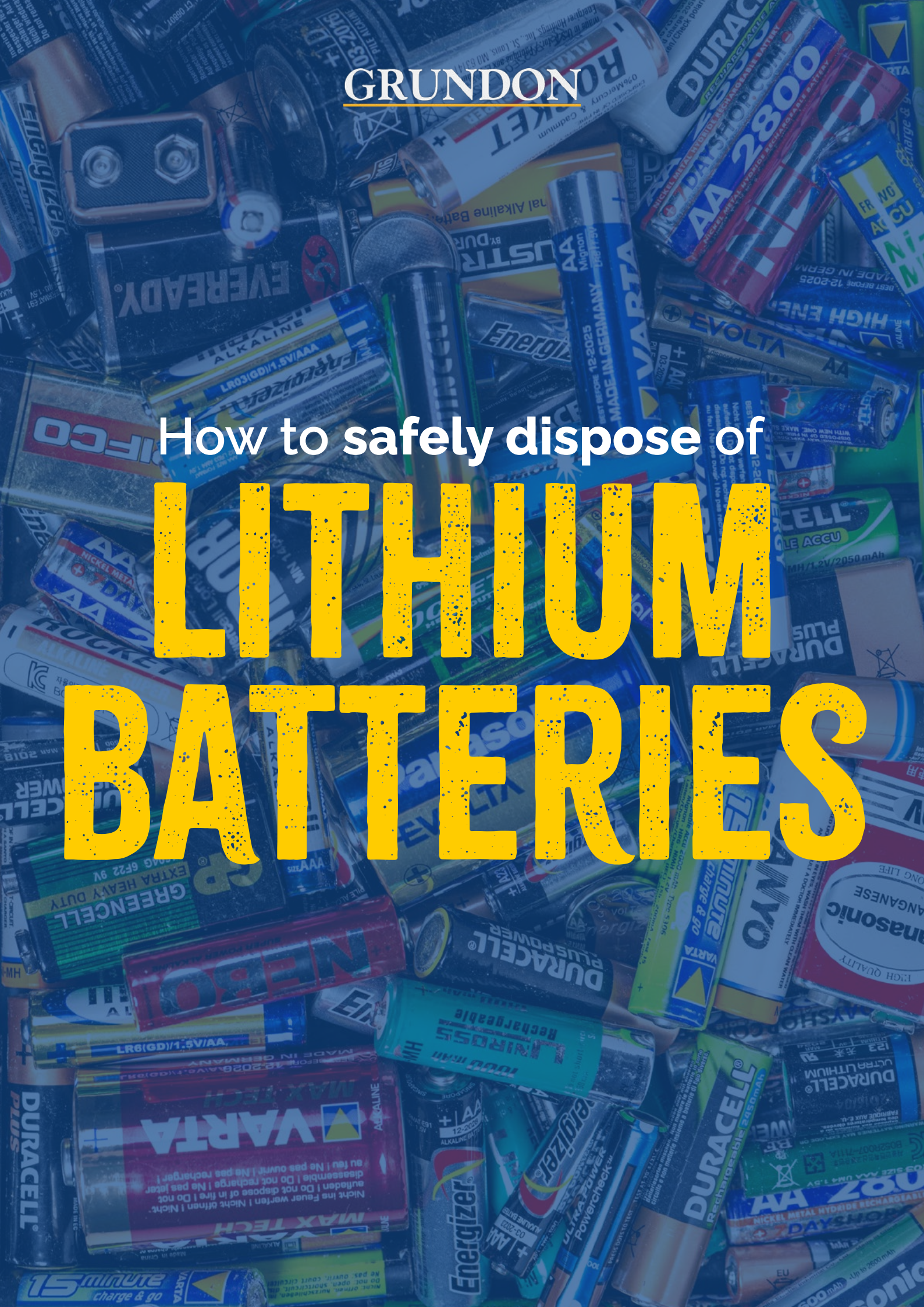

## Where to dispose of lithium batteries

Batteries can be recycled safely at dedicated collection points, often found at your local household waste recycling centre, in supermarkets or DIY stores.

Some councils will collect batteries if they are in a clear bag and placed on top of your bin on your collection day. Please check your local council's website for more information.
